AN ACT

To repeal section 115.350, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to candidate disqualifications.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.350, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 115.350, to read as follows:

115.350. No person shall qualify as a candidate for elective public office in the state of Missouri who has been convicted of or found guilty of or pled guilty to a felony under the laws of this state. **Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (22) of section 115.013 to the contrary, this section shall apply to any person seeking to qualify as a candidate for an elected office in cities of the fourth classification.**
