1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 1842, Page 1,
2 Section A, Line 3, by inserting after all of said line the
3 following:

4 "195.070. 1. A physician, podiatrist, dentist, a
5 registered optometrist certified to administer pharmaceutical
6 agents as provided in section 336.220, or an assistant physician
7 in accordance with section 334.037 or a physician assistant in
8 accordance with section 334.747 in good faith and in the course
9 of his or her professional practice only, may prescribe,
10 administer, and dispense controlled substances or he or she may
11 cause the same to be administered or dispensed by an individual
12 as authorized by statute.

13 2. An advanced practice registered nurse, as defined in
14 section 335.016, but not a certified registered nurse anesthetist
15 as defined in subdivision (8) of section 335.016, who holds a
16 certificate of controlled substance prescriptive authority from
17 the board of nursing under section 335.019 and who is delegated
18 the authority to prescribe controlled substances under a
19 collaborative practice arrangement under section 334.104 may
20 prescribe any controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV,
21 and V of section 195.017. However, no such certified advanced
22 practice registered nurse shall prescribe controlled substance
23 for his or her own self or family. Schedule III narcotic
24 controlled substance prescriptions shall be limited to a one
25 hundred twenty-hour supply without refill.

26 3. A veterinarian, in good faith and in the course of the
27 veterinarian's professional practice only, and not for use by a
28 human being, may prescribe, administer, and dispense controlled

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1 substances and the veterinarian may cause them to be administered
2 by an assistant or orderly under his or her direction and
3 supervision.

4 4. A practitioner shall not accept any portion of a
5 controlled substance unused by a patient, for any reason, if such
6 practitioner did not originally dispense the drug.

7 5. An individual practitioner shall not prescribe or
8 dispense a controlled substance for such practitioner's personal
9 use except in a medical emergency."; and

11 Further amend said bill, Page 17, Section 334.037, Line 129,
12 by inserting after all of said line the following:

13 "12. (1) An assistant physician assistant with a
14 certificate of controlled substance prescriptive authority as
15 provided in this section may prescribe any controlled substance
16 listed in schedule III, IV, or V of section 195.017 when
17 delegated the authority to prescribe controlled substances in a
18 collaborative practice arrangement. Such authority shall be
19 filed with the state board of registration for the healing arts.
20 The collaborating physician shall maintain the right to limit a
21 specific scheduled drug or scheduled drug category that the
22 assistant physician is permitted to prescribe. Any limitations
23 shall be listed in the collaborative practice arrangement.
24 Assistant physicians shall not prescribe controlled substances
25 for themselves or members of their families. Schedule III
26 controlled substances shall be limited to a five-day supply
27 without refill. Assistant physicians who are authorized to
28 prescribe controlled substances under this section shall register
29 with the federal Drug Enforcement Administration and the state
30 bureau of narcotics and dangerous drugs, and shall include the
31 Drug Enforcement Administration registration number on
32 prescriptions for controlled substances.

33 (2) The collaborating physician shall be responsible to
34 determine and document the completion of at least one hundred
35 twenty hours in a four-month period by the assistant physician
36 during which the assistant physician shall practice with the
37 collaborating physician on-site prior to prescribing controlled

1 substances when the collaborating physician is not on-site. Such
2 limitation shall not apply to assistant physicians of
3 population-based public health services as defined in 20 CSR
4 2150-5.100 as of April 30, 2009.

5 (3) An assistant physician shall receive a certificate of
6 controlled substance prescriptive authority from the state board
7 of registration for the healing arts upon verification of
8 licensure under section 334.036."; and

10 Further amend said title, enacting clause and intersectional
11 references accordingly.
