FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Public Retirement** and **County Employees Retirement Fund** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Missouri Local Government Employees Retirement System (LAGERS)** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their system. It is anticipated to have no cost or a potential cost savings to local governments by effectively transferring the legacy plan administration into LAGERS thereby taking advantage of the efficiencies and scale of LAGERS. The decision to elect LAGERS administration is voluntary to local governments.

All plans would be reviewed on an individual basis to assess administrative needs of the transition into LAGERS administrative framework. Initial costs, if any, for programming and other needs, as well as any additional administration work, will be borne by the legacy plan and not LAGERS. These costs would be mutually agreed upon by LAGERS and the local employer prior to LAGERS administration election. It is anticipated that any legacy plan cost will be more than offset from realized cost savings by LAGERS overall administration.
