#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Missouri National Guard**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **Office of the State Public Defender** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume penalty provisions for violations, the component of the bill to have potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for a class A misdemeanor. Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY `13 average of \$5.07 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,851 per offender.)

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation would result in some additional costs, but it is assumed the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.
