FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the State Public Defender (MSPD)** assume for the purposes of the proposed legislation, that caseloads will be reduced minimally for the first year after enactment. MSPD further assumes that individuals who are currently charged with criminal non-support after 12 months in arrears will be charged with criminal non-support after 24 months.

For purpose of the proposed legislation, and as a result of excessive caseloads, the MSPD cannot assume existing staff could be reduced for the one year in question. While the reduced number of cases may be too few or too uncertain to prepare a fiscal note, the MSPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation changes the laws regarding arrearage and the expungement of certain records related to criminal non-support. During the past five years, there has been an average of 5,234 criminal non-support convictions. This legislation should not have a significant impact on the judiciary.

Officials at the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the Columbia Police Department, the City of Columbia, the Springfield Police Department and the Jefferson City Police Department each assume no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Corrections did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
