1 AMEND House Bill No. 1023, Page 1, Section 161.089, Line 1, by deleting the words "After  
2 December 31, 2015," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Before December 31, 2017,"; and

3  
4 Further amend said bill, page, and section, Line 14, by deleting the number "2016" and inserting in  
5 lieu thereof the word "2018"; and

6  
7 Further amend said bill and section, Page 3, Line 65, by inserting immediately after all of said line  
8 the following:

9  
10 "8. The department of elementary and secondary education shall establish a "School Quality  
11 Task Force." Task force members shall be chosen to represent the geographic diversity of the state.  
12 The commissioner of education, the commissioner of higher education, and the director of the  
13 department of economic development shall serve as ex officio members of the task force. All task  
14 force members shall be appointed on or before January 1, 2016. The task force members shall be  
15 appointed as follows:

16 (1) Two school superintendents appointed by a statewide coalition of school administrators;

17 (2) An elementary school principal appointed by a statewide association of elementary  
18 principals;

19 (3) A secondary school principal appointed by a statewide association of secondary  
20 principals;

21 (4) Two public school board members appointed by a statewide association school boards;

22 (5) Two elementary education professionals appointed by the state board of education from  
23 names submitted by statewide professional teachers' organizations;

24 (6) One secondary educational professional appointed by the state board of education from  
25 names submitted by statewide professional teachers' organizations;

26 (7) One secondary education professional appointed by the state board of education from  
27 names submitted by the statewide career and technology educators association;

28 (8) One school guidance counselor appointed by the state board of education from names  
29 submitted by a statewide professional organization of guidance counselors;

30 (9) One representative appointed by a statewide association of public two-year colleges;

31 (10) One representative appointed by a statewide association of public four-year colleges;

32 (11) One representative of a proprietary school appointed by the commissioner of higher  
33 education;

34 (12) One representative from the State Technical College of Missouri appointed by the  
35 president of the college;

36 (13) Four representatives from an innovation campus, as defined in section 178.1100,

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1 appointed by the commissioner of higher education: a representative from the school district, a  
2 representative from a two-year college, and a representative from a four-year college, and a  
3 representative from the business community; and

4 (14) Three representatives from the business community appointed by the director of the  
5 department of economic development.

6 9. The members of the school quality task force established under subsection 8 of this  
7 section shall elect two co-chairs. One co-chair shall be from the business community and one  
8 co-chair shall be from the education community. The task force shall meet at least four times each  
9 year and may hold additional meetings by telephone or video conference. Members of the task force  
10 shall serve without compensation. The department of elementary and secondary education shall  
11 reimburse members for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official  
12 duties. The department of elementary and secondary education shall reimburse school districts for  
13 the cost of the substitute teacher if a task force member is required to miss a school day to attend a  
14 task force meeting. No district policy or administrative action shall require any teacher member to  
15 use personal leave or incur a reduction in pay for participating on the task force.

16 10. The school quality task force established under subsection 8 of this section is hereby  
17 created to study and provide recommendations on the following:

18 (1) Options for comprehensive school quality indicators leading to student success that may  
19 differ from those established under subsection 1 of this section;

20 (2) Options for school quality review models based on successful review models currently in  
21 use;

22 (3) Options for locally-created assessment and accountability systems; and

23 (4) Best practices in parent and community engagement.

24 11. Before December 31, 2016, the school quality task force established under subsection 8  
25 of this section shall present its findings and recommendations to the joint committee on education.  
26 The task force may recommend changes, deletions, or additions to the school quality indicators  
27 established under subsection 1 of this section. The task force may also recommend specific methods  
28 of measuring the school quality indicators. Upon presenting the findings and recommendations to  
29 the joint committee on education, the school quality task force shall dissolve. "; and

31 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
32 accordingly.
