

HB 1725 -- RESISTING ARREST

SPONSOR: Kidd

This bill specifies that an offender who pleads guilty to a fleeing offense after pleading guilty to three prior fleeing offenses is guilty of a class B felony.

An offender who has been convicted of any fleeing offense and pleads guilty to another fleeing offense within five years of the previous conviction is guilty of a class C felony.

Anyone convicted under the provisions of the bill will not be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended execution or imposition of sentence for a period of three calendar years.

This bill is the same as HB 1278 (2015).
