AN ACT

To repeal section 451.090, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to marriage licenses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 451.090, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 451.090, to read as follows:

451.090. 1. No recorder shall, in any event except as herein provided, issue a license authorizing the marriage of any person under [fifteen] seventeen years of age; provided, however, that such license may be issued on order of a circuit or associate circuit judge of the county in which the license is applied for, such license being issued only [for good cause shown and by reason of such unusual conditions as to] after a hearing has been held in which the parties present evidence to the court that would make such marriage advisable. The court, in its order, shall determine that there is no evidence of coercion or abuse of either person entering the marriage.

9 2. No recorder shall issue a license authorizing the marriage of any male under the age 10 of eighteen years or of any female under the age of eighteen years, except with the consent of his 11 or her custodial parent or guardian, which consent shall be given at the time, in writing, stating 12 the residence of the person giving such consent, signed and sworn to before an officer authorized 13 to administer oaths. In no instance shall a license be issued authorizing the marriage of any 14 male or female twenty-one years of age or older if the other party to the marriage is less 15 than seventeen years of age.

3. The recorder shall state in every license whether the parties applying for same, one or either or both of them, are of age, or whether the male is under the age of eighteen years or

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18 the female under the age of eighteen years, and if the male is under the age of eighteen years or

the female is under the age of eighteen years, the name of the custodial parent or guardianconsenting to such marriage. Applicants shall provide proof of age to the recorder in the

21 form of a certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate, the applicant's passport, or

22 other government-issued identification, which shall then be documented by the recorder.

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
