AN ACT

To repeal section 170.048, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the Jason Flatt act.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 170.048, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 170.048, to read as follows:

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170.048. 1. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Jason Flatt Act".
2. By July 1, 2018, each district shall adopt a policy for youth suicide awareness and prevention, including plans for how the district will provide for the training and education of its district employees. Each district shall develop the policy in consultation with school and

district employees. Each district shall develop the policy in consultation with school and
community stakeholders, any mental health professionals employed by schools in the
district, and suicide prevention experts.

7 [2.] 3. Each district's policy shall address and include, but not be limited to, the 8 following:

9 10 (1) Strategies that can help identify students who are at possible risk of suicide;

(2) Strategies and protocols for helping students at possible risk of suicide; and

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(3) Protocols for responding to a suicide death.

12 [3.] 4. By July 1, 2017, the department of elementary and secondary education shall 13 develop a model policy that districts may adopt. When developing the model policy, the 14 department shall cooperate, consult with, and seek input from organizations that have expertise 15 in youth suicide awareness and prevention. By July 1, 2021, and at least every three years 16 thereafter, the department shall request information and seek feedback from districts, school and 17 community stakeholders, mental health professionals employed by schools, and suicide

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prevention experts on their experience with the policy for youth suicide awareness and prevention. The department shall review this information and may use it to adapt the department's model policy. The department shall post any information on its website that it has received from districts that it deems relevant. The department shall not post any confidential information or any information that personally identifies any student or school employee.

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
