

# House Concurrent Resolution No. 31

## 99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE MCGEE.

1           **WHEREAS**, in 2002 Missouri passed the Safe Place for Newborns Act to protect  
2 newborn children from injury and death caused by abandonment by a parent and to provide safe  
3 and secure alternatives to such abandonment; and

4

5           **WHEREAS**, a baby can be left, up to 1 year old, with an on duty employee at any  
6 hospital, fire department, emergency medical professional, or law enforcement agency in  
7 Missouri; and

8

9           **WHEREAS**, baby safe-haven laws allow you to give your baby to a responsible adult  
10 at a designated location and walk away, no questions asked. If you do not return to reclaim your  
11 baby, your parental rights will be terminated in a few months, and the child will be adopted by  
12 a family waiting for a child; and

13

14           **WHEREAS**, infant abandonment laws or "Baby Safe-Haven" laws exist to enable a  
15 person to relinquish an unwanted infant anonymously. If a parent cannot care for their child, they  
16 can bring that baby into a safe-haven location and leave the baby with a responsible adult, no  
17 questions asked. As long as the baby has not been abused, the person may do so without fear of  
18 arrest or prosecution; and

20           **WHEREAS**, the child will be examined and given medical treatment, if needed. The  
21 Social Services Administration will then take custody through Child Protective Services and  
22 place the child with an appropriate caregiver; and

24           **WHEREAS**, if a parent changes their mind, they will have a few days to come back and  
25 speak with the authorities about what arrangements can be made for the baby; and

27           **WHEREAS**, as of 2012, Missouri’s safe-haven law has been used 31 times statewide  
28 since 2005:

30           **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of  
31 Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate  
32 concurring therein, hereby designate April 6 of each year as “Safe-Haven for Newborns  
33 Awareness Day” in the state of Missouri; and

35           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the General Assembly recommends to the citizens  
36 of this state to observe the day by educating themselves on Missouri’s safe-haven law and  
37 promote awareness of safe-havens in the state.
