

TAX RELIEF FOR MISSOURI SENIORS AND DISABLED

The Missouri Property Tax Credit allows a credit to certain senior citizens and 100% disabled individuals based on total household income (taxable and nontaxable) and the amount of property taxes or rent paid. The credit is for a maximum of \$750 for renters and \$1,100 for those who own and occupy a home.

- To be eligible a person must be:**
- 65 years of age or older, **OWNED AND OCCUPIED HOME FOR ENTIRE YEAR**
 - 60 years of age or older and receiving Social Security surviving spouse benefits, or **Single - \$30,000**
 - 100% disabled **Married filing jointly - \$34,000**
 - RENTERS/PART YEAR OWNERS**
 - Single - \$27,500**
 - Married filing jointly - \$29,500**
