Tax increment financing enables cities and developers to finance construction costs associated with redevelopment of blighted areas. Missouri's Department of Revenue reports that over 52,000 new jobs have been created, along with over 13,000 jobs retained, to date in Missouri through tax increment financing of specific projects. 
