


How to Track Legislation online at www.house.mo.gov

Start by logging on to www.house.mo.gov To hear **live debate** during session, click the Live Debate Audio link under the Chamber Messageboard window.



The full texts of legislation can be located by number, keyword (subject matter), or sponsor with the **Bill Information tab** and **Bill Tracking flyout tab on the left of the Home page**. Links provide information on actions, hearings, and fiscal notes, which are analyses of the financial impact of bills.

You can also use the Bill Search located near the top right corner above the House News button. The House of Representatives' website also has committee hearing schedules, calendars, floor schedules, and the Journals (meeting minutes) for both the House and Senate. The Past Session Archives link has a wealth of information on bills passed in previous years as well as listings of House members in each of those years.



2016 END OF SESSION REPORT

The following is a list of some of the bills Truly Agreed to and Finally Passed by the General Assembly this session.

HB 1562 - SEXUAL TRAFFICKING

Knowingly advertising a minor to participate in a commercial sex act, performance, or production of explicit sexual material is added to the offense of sexual trafficking of a child. The bill adds the advertising element to the offense of trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation. It specifies any visual or aural recording or photographs of a minor in the possession of a Child Assessment Center, health care provider, or multidisciplinary investigation team member cannot be disclosed without a court hearing, but a person or party with legitimate interest in the court proceeding involving a minor victim may view any visual or aural recordings or photographs of a minor with a court order.

Victims of sexual trafficking are added to the Address Confidentiality Program run by the Secretary of State aimed to protect victims of domestic violence, rape, sexual assault, or stalking by assigning substitute addresses to such victims. Knowingly accessing or attempting to access the address of a participant of the program has been added to the elements of aggravated stalking. Beginning in 2017, as a result of Senate Bill 491 (2014), it will be added to the elements of first degree stalking.

HB 1565 - PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

This bill increases the asset limits for MO HealthNet permanent and totally disabled, blind, and aged claimants starting in fiscal year 2018, from no greater than \$1,000 for individuals to \$2,000 and from no greater than \$2,000 for married couples to \$4,000. For each fiscal year after 2018 through 2021, those asset limits will be increased \$1,000 and \$2,000 respectively so that by fiscal year 2021 the limit for individuals will be \$5,000 and for married couples \$10,000. Beginning in fiscal year 2022, these limits must be modified to reflect any cost-of-living adjustments. The bill excludes medical savings accounts and independent living accounts as defined in the Ticket to Work Health Assurance Program from calculation.

HB 1568 - NALOXONE PRESCRIPTIONS

Any licensed pharmacist may prescribe naloxone and is not liable for an individual who administers naloxone to someone suffering an opioid-related overdose. Any individual or organization may store and dispense naloxone without being subject to requirements if he or she does not collect a fee or compensation for dispensing when the person or organization is acting under an order issued by a health care professional.

HB 1631 - VOTER IDENTIFICATION

Requires voters wishing to vote in a public election to present photo identification. Approved forms of identification include a Missouri driver's license, a nondriver's

license, a document issued by the United States or the State of Missouri containing the name and photo of the individual, or any armed services identification containing a photo.

Anyone without photo identification may vote a regular ballot after signing a statement that they are qualified to vote and presenting specified forms of identification including school identification, utility bills, bank statements, paychecks, and government documents. The Secretary of State may approve nonphotographic means of identification by rule. Persons signing a statement shall be required to have their photo retained by election authorities for future identification purposes. Provisional ballots will be used for those who refuse to sign a statement of eligibility and they must return to the polling place with photo identification and matching signature to vote.

The state will provide one free nondriver's license for purposes of voting and will pay the cost of specified documents, including birth certificates, marriage licenses, divorce decrees, adoption certificates, name change court documents, social security cards, and naturalization documents. If there is no appropriation, then the requirements of the bill will not be enforced.

These provisions will become effective only upon voter approval of a companion constitutional amendment, HJR 53.

HB 1649 - IMMUNITY FROM CIVIL LIABILITY

Any individual who forcibly enters a motor vehicle to remove a minor from the vehicle is immune from civil liability under certain conditions. This provision does not affect the person's civil liability if the person attempts to render aid to the minor.

HB 1979 - REGISTERED LOBBYISTS

Members of the General Assembly, statewide elected officials, and anyone whose appointment is subject to Senate confirmation are prohibited from registering as lobbyists for six months after their term in office. This provision applies only to lobbying for pay and does not apply to lobbying for state purposes. Members of the General Assembly and statewide elected officials may not solicit registered lobbyists for jobs while they hold office.

HB 2379 - SCHOOLS

Each public school will screen students for dyslexia and related disorders at appropriate times in accordance with rules established by the State Board of Education. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) must develop guidelines for screening and classroom support. The school board of each district and governing board of each charter school must provide reasonable support consistent with the guidelines developed by DESE.

Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, practicing teacher assistance programs will include two hours of in-service training regarding dyslexia and related disorders.

This bill establishes the Legislative Task Force on Dyslexia. The task force will make recommendations for a statewide system for identification, intervention, and delivery of support for students with dyslexia including the development of resource materials, professional development activities, and proposed legislation.

The task force authorized under these provisions will expire on August 31, 2018.

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, two hours of training in youth suicide awareness and prevention can be part of the professional development hours

required for licensed teachers' State Board of Education certification. DESE will develop guidelines suitable for this training. By July 1, 2018, each district must adopt a policy, which must address strategies that can help identify students who are at possible risk of suicide.

HCR 58 - VALUE OF AGRICULTURAL LAND

In each odd-numbered year, the State Tax Commission must publish a value for farm land based on its productive capability. The General Assembly disapproved the revaluation of agricultural land proposed for grades one through four by the State Tax Commission in December 2015, because the new values were beyond what the legislature considered fair and reasonable.

HJR 53 - VOTER IDENTIFICATION

If the joint resolution is approved at election, voters may be required by general law to identify themselves and verify that they are a United States citizen and a Missouri resident by providing a form of identification that may include a valid government-issued photo identification. Exceptions to the identification requirement may also be provided for by general law. HB 1631 provides the exceptions, contingent on voter approval of HJR 53.

SB 656 - CONCEALED CARRY

The bill modifies provisions relating to county sheriffs, self-defense, unlawful use of weapons, and concealed carry permits and permit fees. The current prohibition on carrying concealed weapons is repealed, except for specified places. An alternative method for certification to the current training standards is allowed. Options to obtain extended or lifetime conceal-carry permits are created. Invoking self-defense as a legal justification is expanded by changing the duty to retreat under certain circumstances involving private property. The bill specifies that funds received processing a concealed carry permit application shall be used only to supplement the sheriff's funding received from other sources. The county commission cannot reduce any sheriff's budget as a result of funds received for processing applications. The bill requires certain agencies and groups to submit two sets of fingerprints to the sheriff of a county of the third classification to search the Missouri criminal records repository and the Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history files, if the sheriff elects to provide this service.

SB 814 - MILITARY INCOME TAX DEDUCTION

Beginning with the 2016 tax year, all income received by an individual for active duty military service that is included in the federal adjusted gross income may also be deducted from their Missouri income to determine their taxable income. If the individual files a combined return with a spouse, any active duty income received may be deducted from their combined Missouri income.

SB 844 - LIVESTOCK TRESPASS LIABILITY

Currently, if any horses, cattle, or other livestock break through any fence or trespass onto another's property, the owner of such animal is strictly liable for damages to another's property. This bill specifies that the owner of such animal would only be liable for damages sustained to another's property if the animal owner was negligent.


Missouri General Revenue Operating Budget - After Vetoes
