

Medicaid is a health assistance program administered by the state according to certain federal guidelines. Ten percent of all Americans benefit from the program. Medicaid pays for visits to the doctor; immunization against diseases such as measles, tetanus, and polio; some ambulance services in case of emergency; in-patient hospital care; yearly eye examinations; children's glasses; laboratory and x-ray services; home health care services; family planning services; certain dental work; certain prescriptions; and food stamps.
