



TAX RELIEF FOR MISSOURI SENIORS AND DISABLED

The Missouri Property Tax Credit allows a credit to certain senior citizens and 100% disabled individuals based on total household income (taxable and nontaxable) and the amount of property taxes or rent paid. The credit is for a maximum of \$750 for renters and \$1,100 for those who own and occupy a home.

To be eligible a person must be:

- 65 years of age or older,
- 60 years of age or older and receiving Social Security

surviving spouse benefits, or

- 100% disabled

The maximum income level to qualify:

OWNED AND OCCUPIED HOME FOR ENTIRE YEAR

Single - \$30,000

Married filing jointly - \$34,000

RENTERS/PART YEAR OWNERS

Single - \$27,500

Married filing jointly - \$29,500

2015 END OF SESSION REPORT

The following is a list of all of the bills Truly Agreed to and Finally Passed by the General Assembly this session.


