191.255; 195.815; Section B	HB 1896 (.04P Perfected version)	Roberts	This bill prohibits a state agency from disclosing to the federal government any information of a person who applied for a medical marijuana card. Any violation of this is a class E felony. DHSS shall require all employees to submit fingerprints for criminal background checks to the State Highway Patrol.
160.485	HB 1991 (Committee version)	Shields	This bill defines "bleeding control kits" and requires DESE to develop a traumatic blood loss protocol for school personnel by January 1, 2021. A bleeding control kit shall be in each classroom in each school district.
208.057	HB 2552	Wright	This bill allows MO HealthNet recipients who would otherwise become ineligible due to an increase in income, to continue to qualify for benefits by paying a premium as specified in the bill. DSS is required to develop a payroll deduction program for this purpose. The department must also establish a program to assist MO HealthNet recipients in transitioning off MO HealthNet while working toward gaining employment, increasing income, or gaining work-related education or training.
197.305; 197.318	HB 2093	Bondon	Currently, a nursing home may increase its licensed bed capacity if it has maintained a 90% average occupancy rate for the previous 6 quarters. This bill changes the requirement to 85% average occupancy rate. A nursing home may transfer or sell individual long-term care licensed beds. This bill requires these beds to be licensed and available. The facility cannot expand its licensed bed capacity for 5 years or until the average occupancy of licensed and available beds within a 15-mile radius is 85% for the previous 6 quarters.
190.241	HB 2520	Bondon	The bill specifies that the Department of Health and Senior Services shall not deny trauma center status to a hospital based on its distance from another trauma center.
208.175	HB 2305 (Committee version)	Ruth	This bill makes changes to the membership of the Drug Utilization Review Board. The bill removes provisions requiring members to have specific knowledge and expertise in certain areas. The bill removes provisions that outline the election of the chairperson, how often the board must meet, and what constitutes a quorum.
217.850; 577.800; 632.460	HCS HB 1898 (Perfected version)	Henderson	This bill creates the offense of unlawful use of an unmanned aircraft near a correctional center, mental health hospital, or certain open air facilities, including sports stadiums holding 5,000 or more persons, as defined in the bill. The offense of unlawful use of an unmanned aircraft near a correctional center or mental health hospital is an infraction unless the person uses the unmanned aircraft for certain purpose. The offense of unlawful use of an unmanned aircraft near an open air facility is a class A misdemeanor unless the person uses the unmanned aircraft for certain purposes.

209.150; 209.200; 209.204	SB 644 (Perfected)	Hoskins	This bill modifies the definition of a "service dog" and adds "mental health service dog" to the definition of a service dog. Any person knowingly misrepresenting a dog as a service dog for the purposes of receiving accommodations regarding service dogs under the Americans with Disabilities Act shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor for the first offense and a Class B misdemeanor for each subsequent offense. Any person knowingly misrepresenting any animal as an assistance animal, as described in the act, for the purposes of receiving accommodations regarding assistance animals under the Fair Housing Act or the Rehabilitation Act shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor for the first offense and a Class B misdemeanor for each subsequent offense.
9.245	HB 1353	Allred	HB 1353 - This bill designates May as "Lupus Awareness Month" and May 10th of each year as "Lupus Awareness Day" and encourages citizens to wear purple and raise awareness about Lupus.
376.782	HB 2468	Carpenter	This bill modifies an insurance mandate relating to breast cancer screening and evaluation.
191.1160	HB 2288	Riggs	This bill establishes the "21st Century Missouri Patient Education Task Force."
262.760	HB 1752	Spencer	This bill specifies that no law, ordinance, or rule may be enacted by any village, town, city or county to terminate, ban, or effectively ban, by creating an undue financial hardship, the job of working animals or animal enterprise.
311.020	HB 1285	Pike	This bill adds powdered alcohol to the definition of intoxicating liquor used in state liquor control laws.
261.099	HB 1583	Haden	This bill specifies that the Missouri Department of Agriculture, the United States Department of Agriculture, the county sheriff and any other federal or Missouri state agency with statutory or regulatory authority have exclusive authority to inspect the grounds or facilities in Missouri used for the production of eggs, milk or other dairy products, raising of livestock, or the production or raising of dogs or other animals not used to produce any food product. This bill Prohibits the inspection of certain grounds or facilities in Missouri to enforce the laws of a state other than Missouri.
376.383	HB 2089	Schroer	This bill modifies the health carrier interest penalty related to insurance claims.
376.1578	HB 2508	Jeff Coleman	This bill is related to credentialing of practitioners by health carriers. If a health carrier determines the application is not complete, the health carrier shall have 10 days to request any additional information from the practitioner. The application shall be considered complete upon receipt of the requested additional information.
595.201; 595.202	HB 2595/SB 812 and HB 1815	Coleman/Sater and Kelly	This bill establishes the "Sexual Assault Survivors' Bill of Rights" and the "Missouri Rights of Victims of Sexual Assault Task Force". This bill modifies current law regarding procedures for tracking evidentiary collection kits.
