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Missouri Senior Citizens May Be Eligible for Property Tax Relief as New Law Takes Effect

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. – After the 2024 passage of Senate Bill 756, Missouri seniors may be eligible for a property tax credit to reduce their property tax liability.

To qualify for the tax credit, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a Missouri resident.
- Be 62 years of age or older.
- Be the property owner or have a legal or equitable interest in the home.
- Be liable for the payment of real property taxes on the home.
- Occupy the property as their primary residence.
- Have no delinquent taxes.

To apply, contact your **County Assessor's Office** to confirm if they have implemented the tax credit and to obtain the list of required documents for proving eligibility.

The deadline for the initial application is December 31, 2024. Applicants will be notified by mail or email if their application is approved.
