## State Representative Chris Brown Named Committee Chairman for 103rd General Assembly

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. – State Representative Chris Brown is proud to announce his newly appointed House committee assignment this legislative session, as designated by House Speaker Jonathan Patterson. Rep. Brown will serve as Chairman of a key committee, Higher Education and Workforce Development, for the Missouri House of Representatives' 103rd General Assembly.

"I am honored to serve the people of Missouri as Chairman of the Higher Education and Workforce Development committee." Brown, R-Kansas City, said. "I look forward to working with the members of this committee as we work to create policies to help Missourians save their hard-earned dollars while removing unnecessary regulations."

The committee on Higher Education and Workforce Development may consider and report upon bills and matters referred to it relating to higher education, including matters relating to financing, facilities, staff, curriculum, and related matters, and matters relating to the regulation and administration of state policies regarding the attraction, training, retention, and safety of the workforce.

"The work done in committees includes some of the most critical moments of the legislative process." Speaker Patterson, R-Lees Summit, said. "In committees, every Missourian has the opportunity to come and testify for, or against, legislation. House Committees are the first step in refining legislation to help make life safer, better, and more affordable for Missouri families, and we know Rep. Brown will work to do just that."
