Representative Tara Peters Celebrates Governor Kehoe's Signing of Key Legislation Benefiting Missourians

JEFFERSON CITY, MO. – State Representative Tara Peters proudly announces that Governor Mike Kehoe has signed several bills into law that incorporate critical language from her legislative proposals, delivering meaningful improvements for the constituents of District 122 and all Missourians.

The bills, HB 495 (including language from Rep. Peters' HB 723), SB 79 (including language from her HB 398), HB 225, and SB 271 (including language from her HB 724), address a range of pressing issues impacting communities across the state.

"I am thrilled to see Governor Kehoe sign these bills into law, giving the constituents of District 122 and the state of Missouri the fixes they need," stated Peters, R-Rolla.

These new laws reflect Rep. Peters' commitment to addressing key priorities for her constituents. The legislation includes provisions to protect property rights, improve access to healthcare, and strengthen the safety and effectiveness of Missouri's emergency medical services (EMS) system.

"The changes included in my legislation are here to help Missourians, from protecting their property rights, by helping ensure healthcare access is more available, and ensuring our EMS system is safer, stronger, and working for those in their communities," Peters added.

Rep. Peters remains dedicated to advocating for policies that enhance the quality of life for her constituents and all Missouri residents. She looks forward to seeing the positive impact of these newly signed laws.
