Missouri House Passes HB 2320 Designating Branson as "Live Entertainment Capital" of Missouri

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. – The Missouri House of Representatives is recognizing Branson, Mo., as the "Live Entertainment Capital" of the Show-Me State.
