### AN ACT

To repeal section 571.030, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to unlawful use of weapons, with penalty provisions.

---

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 571.030, RSMo 2000, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 571.030, to read as follows:

- 571.030. 1. A person commits the crime of unlawful use of weapons if [he] **the person** knowingly:
- (1) Carries concealed upon or about his **or her** person a knife, a firearm, a blackjack or any other weapon readily capable of lethal use; or
  - (2) Sets a spring gun; or
  - (3) Discharges or shoots a firearm into a dwelling house, a railroad train, boat, aircraft, or motor vehicle as defined in section 302.010, RSMo, or any building or structure used for the assembling of people; or
  - (4) Exhibits, in the presence of one or more persons, any weapon readily capable of lethal use in an angry or threatening manner; or
  - (5) Possesses or discharges a firearm or projectile weapon while intoxicated; or
  - (6) Discharges a firearm within one hundred yards of any occupied school house, courthouse, or church building; or
  - (7) Discharges or shoots a firearm at a mark, at any object, or at random, on, along or across a public highway or discharges or shoots a firearm into any outbuilding; or
  - (8) Carries a firearm or any other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any church

**EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.**

17 or place where people have assembled for worship, or into any school, or into any election  
18 precinct on any election day, or into any building owned or occupied by any agency of the federal  
19 government, state government, or political subdivision thereof, or into any public assemblage  
20 of persons met for any lawful purpose; or

21 (9) Discharges or shoots a firearm at or from a motor vehicle, as defined in section  
22 301.010, RSMo, while within any city, town, or village, and discharges or shoots a firearm at any  
23 person, or at any other motor vehicle, or at any building or habitable structure, unless the person  
24 was lawfully acting in self-defense.

25 2. Subdivisions (1), (3), (4), (6), (7), (8) and (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall not  
26 apply to or affect any of the following:

27 (1) All state, county and municipal law enforcement officers possessing the duty and  
28 power of arrest for violation of the general criminal laws of the state or for violation of  
29 ordinances of counties or municipalities of the state, or any person summoned by such officers  
30 to assist in making arrests or preserving the peace while actually engaged in assisting such  
31 officer;

32 (2) Wardens, superintendents and keepers of prisons, penitentiaries, jails and other  
33 institutions for the detention of persons accused or convicted of crime;

34 (3) Members of the armed forces or national guard while performing their official duty;

35 (4) Those persons vested by article V, section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri with the  
36 judicial power of the state and those persons vested by article III of the Constitution of the United  
37 States with the judicial power of the United States, the members of the federal judiciary;

38 (5) Any person whose bona fide duty is to execute process, civil or criminal;

39 (6) Any federal probation officer;

40 (7) Any state probation or parole officer, including supervisors and members of the  
41 board of probation and parole; and

42 (8) Any corporate security advisor meeting the definition and fulfilling the requirements  
43 of the regulations established by the board of police commissioners under section 84.340, RSMo;  
44 **and**

45 **(9) Any county prosecutor.**

46 3. Subdivisions (1), (5) and (8) of subsection 1 of this section do not apply when the  
47 [actor] **person** is transporting such weapons in a nonfunctioning state or in an unloaded state  
48 when ammunition is not readily accessible or when such weapons are not readily accessible.  
49 Subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section does not apply when the [actor] **person** is also in  
50 possession of an exposed firearm or projectile weapon for the lawful pursuit of game, or is in  
51 [his] **such person's** dwelling unit or upon business premises over which the [actor] **person** has  
52 possession, authority or control, or is traveling in a continuous journey peaceably through this

53 state.

54 4. Unlawful use of weapons is a class D felony unless committed [under] **pursuant to**  
55 subdivision (5), (6), (7) or (8) of subsection 1 of this section, in which cases it is a class B  
56 misdemeanor, or subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section, in which case it is a class B  
57 felony, except that if the violation of subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section results in  
58 injury or death to another person, it is a class A felony.

59 5. Violations of subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall be punished as  
60 follows:

61 (1) For the first violation a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term  
62 of imprisonment for a class B felony;

63 (2) For any violation by a prior offender as defined in section 558.016, RSMo, a person  
64 shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without  
65 the possibility of parole, probation or conditional release for a term of ten years;

66 (3) For any violation by a persistent offender as defined in section 558.016, RSMo, a  
67 person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony  
68 without the possibility of parole, probation, or conditional release;

69 (4) For any violation which results in injury or death to another person, a person shall  
70 be sentenced to an authorized disposition for a class A felony.

71 6. Any person knowingly aiding or abetting any other person in the violation of  
72 subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall be subject to the same penalty as that  
73 prescribed by this section for violations by other persons.
