9	Whereas, the average lifespan has increased to age 76, with nearly 80 percent of
10	the population living past the age of 65. Projections based on the United States Census Bureau
11	estimates indicate that the number of persons ages 65 and over will grow to almost 40 million
1213	by the year 2010 and by the year 2020 the number of persons over the age of 85 will be between 7 and 8 million; and

15	Whereas, more people are living with disability, with an estimated 8.6 million
16	persons having difficulty with one or more activities of daily living and 4.1 million persons
17	needing personal assistance of some kind; and

19	Whereas, universal design strives to integrate persons with disabilities into the
20	mainstream and recognizes the significant limitations imposed by products and environments
21	designed and built without regard to the needs and rights of all citizens of this nation and state;
