AN ACT

To amend chapter 311, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to Sunday liquor sales.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 311, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be

known as section 311.104, to read as follows: 311.104. 1. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter to the contrary,

- any person who possesses the qualifications required by this chapter, and who meets the requirements of and complies with the provisions of this chapter may apply for, and the
- supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control may issue, a license to sell intoxicating liquor by
- 5 the drink at retail for consumption on the premises of any place of entertainment, as
- defined in this section, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. on Sunday and midnight on Sunday.
- As used in this section, the term "place of entertainment" means any establishment located
- in a county with a charter form of government and with more than two hundred fifty
- thousand but fewer than three hundred fifty thousand inhabitants which has gross annual
- sales in excess of one hundred fifty thousand dollars and the establishment has been in 10
- operation for at least one year. 11
- 12 2. The authority for the collection of fees by cities and counties as provided in
- section 311.220, and all other laws and regulations of the state relating to the sale of liquor 13
- by the drink for consumption on the premises where sold, shall apply to a place of 14
- entertainment in the same manner as they apply to establishments licensed pursuant to 15
- sections 311.085, 311.090, and 311.095, and in addition to all other fees required by law, 16

17 a place of entertainment shall pay an additional fee of two hundred dollars a year payable

18 at the same time and in the same manner as its other license fees.
