ASSUMPTION

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

Currently, a school superintendent may convene a hearing within five working days of a request to register a student if there is a reason to believe the admission of the student would create an immediate danger. This proposal extends the time to 15 working days.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.


