FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Office of Secretary of State** stated that statewide newspaper publication of state statutes cost approximately \$1,289 per column inch based on estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service x 3 for multiple printings as required by the Constitution and state statute = \$3,867 per column inch. Estimate total number of inches for this amendment to be 5 inches, which includes title header and certification paragraph. \$3,867 x 5 inches = \$19,335. Officials stated that these costs are based on 2004 figures and are subject to change.

Officials of the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning** assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Kansas City Board of Election Commission** stated that if the Amendment were voted upon in August or November the state would pay its share of the direct cost of legal notices in their jurisdiction. Officials stated that legal costs could range from \$10,000 to \$25,000. If the election were held at any other time the state might be required to pay all costs.

Officials of **Cass County** assume no fiscal impact.

DESCRIPTION


This proposed constitutional amendment prohibits any person from being elected Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, or State Auditor more than twice. No person who has held the office of or acted as Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, or State Auditor for more than two years of another person's term may be elected more than once.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
