FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol**—in response to an identical proposal (LR #0984-01/SB 227)—assume the legislation would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials with the **Department of Transportation** (MoDOT) assume that unless civic organizations or individual donors contribute funds for the fabrication and installation costs of the signs, MoDOT will be required to bear the costs. MoDOT estimates such costs to be approximately \$787, which would be paid from the Road Fund.

Oversight assumes that private organizations or individuals will pay for the appropriate signage, resulting in no fiscal impact to MoDOT or other agencies.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

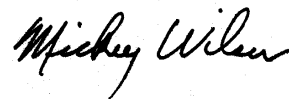
DESCRIPTION
