

House Resolution No. 302

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives hold in high esteem those Show-Me State educational institutions which admirably prepare today’s students for their roles as lifelong learners and future societal leaders; and

Whereas, Logan-Rogersville R-VIII School District was established in 1964 and passed a \$14.9 million bond issue on April 2, 2002, after many years of growth and achievement; and

Whereas, on January 27, 2005, the citizens residing within the Logan-Rogersville R-VIII School District saw their pledged financial support turn into concrete reality when a new 180,000 square foot high school facility was officially opened with a ribbon-cutting ceremony; and

Whereas, designed to fulfill the educational needs of six hundred students, the new Logan-Rogersville high school facility also depended upon the visionary guidance of past School Board members, Brenda Miller, Bill Nimsick, and Steve McCrea; current Board members, J.D. Fielden, President, Kyle Jessen, Vice President, Tim Ewing, Marvin Grier, Jr., Chuck Medley, Lisa Spragg, and Tim Felton; administrators, Dr. Allan Markley, Dr. Gary Hogue, John Hetherington, Yolanda Anderson, and Dr. Doug Hayter; and members of the Facilities Planning Committee, the Logan-Rogersville PTA, Jack Ball Architects, and Don Crawford Construction; and

Whereas, education is mandated by the state and, according to Article III, Section 36, of the constitution, is the responsibility of the General Assembly after the paying of public debts; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper that the Missouri House of Representatives should pause in its diverse legislative endeavors in order to recognize momentous events in the histories of such outstanding local educational institutions as the Logan-Rogersville R-VIII School District:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-third General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the long history of educational success enjoyed by the Logan Rogersville R-VIII School District and to convey this legislative body’s most heartfelt congratulations to the citizens of the Logan Rogersville R-VIII School District and all of those involved in the planning, completion, and opening of the new high school facility; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the Logan-Rogersville R-VIII School District.
