## **AN ACT**

Relating to the designation of March as kidney cancer awareness month.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Whereas, each year more than 36,000 people in the United States are diagnosed with kidney cancer, and more than 100,000 kidney cancer survivors are currently living in the 3 United States and Missouri; and 4 Whereas, the exact cause of kidney cancer is unknown; and 5 6 Whereas, kidney cancer occurs nearly twice as often in men as in women and 7 mostly in men over 40 years of age; and 8 9 Whereas, the American Cancer Society estimates that this year there will be more 10 11 than 36,000 new cases of kidney cancer (approximately 22,500 in men and 13,700 in women) in the United States; and 12 13 Whereas, other than surgery, the most commonly used treatments for kidney 14 cancer are immunotherapy, radiation, and chemotherapy; and 15 16 Whereas, breakthroughs in research over the last year have given renewed hope 17 to patients who previously had few treatment options: 18
