Reported from the Committee on Rules March 16, 2006 with recommendation that House Resolution Do Pass (with no time limit for debate).

JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment repealing section 44 of article IV of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to bird, fish, game, wildlife, or forestry resources.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next
2 following the first Monday in November, 2006, or at a special election to be called by the
3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for
4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to article IV of the Constitution of the state of
5 Missouri:

Section A. Section 44, article IV, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed and one new
2 section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 44, article IV, to read as follows:

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

Section 44. **1.** Sections 40-43, inclusive, of this article shall be self-enforcing, and laws
2 not inconsistent therewith may be enacted in aid thereof. All existing laws inconsistent with this
3 article shall no longer remain in force or effect.

4 **2. No initiative proposal relating to the opportunity to harvest bird, fish, game,**
5 **wildlife, or forestry resources shall take effect unless approved by a two-thirds majority**
6 **of the votes cast thereon, except that this provision shall not apply to any initiative proposal**
7 **involving the establishment, amendment or repeal of sales taxes for conservation purposes**
8 **pursuant to section 43(a) of this article.**
