**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

**ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Agriculture** and the **Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from the current session (SB 1100, LR # 5288-01), officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assumed the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume this proposal expands the crime of stealing animals by modifying the specifically-named animals to those defined as livestock.

Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the enhancement of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost either through incarceration (FY05 average of \$39.13 per inmate, per day or an annual cost of \$14,282 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY03 average of \$3.15 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,150 per offender).

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in additional unknown costs to the department. Eight (8) persons would have to be incarcerated per fiscal year to exceed \$100,000 annually. Due to the narrow scope of this new crime, it is assumed the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year for the DOC.

**Officials from the Office of the State Public Defender did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.**

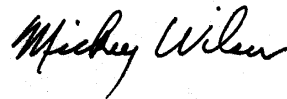
This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
