

House Resolution No. 2115

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives occasionally pause in their diverse legislative endeavors in order to acknowledge milestone events in the histories of Show-Me State high school athletic programs that truly embodied the highest standards of sportsmanship, teamwork, training, and perseverance; and

Whereas, on May 2, 2008, the 1991 girls soccer team from Oakville High School will be inducted into the Oakville High School Hall of Fame in light of its attaining the well-deserved title of State Champions by a record-setting 5-0 margin of victory; and

Whereas, on its way to becoming the first public school girls soccer team to have a First Place finish in state competition, the Oakville girls soccer team garnered a 31-1 win-loss season record and set still-standing team season records for Most Victories with 31, Fewest Losses with 1, Most Shutouts with 23, and Longest Winning Streak with 18; and

Whereas, individual team records that are still standing include Kris Fosdick getting 24 goals as a rookie, Jackie Billet getting 25 assists in a season, and Jenni Burton getting a three-goal hat trick that pushed her career total to 110; and

Whereas, admirably guided by coaches David Robben, Tom Brannon and Bounama Dieye, the Oakville girls soccer team consisted of Jennifer Frohlich, Nicole Ewen, Heather Bigott, Tisa Bauer, Kris Fosdick, Sherri Kunz, Nicole Icenhower, Amy Majnerich, Gina Schwer, Amanda Lee, Jackie Billet, Amy Rooney, Amy Broeckelmann, Amy Schmidt, Amy Spinks, Jennifer Burton, Julie Stephens, Jennifer Carolla, Amy Abernathy, and Kelly Verdin; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper that the Missouri House of Representatives should recognize such outstanding Missouri high school athletic teams as the state champion 1991 Oakville girls soccer team:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-fourth General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the well-deserved induction of the 1991 Oakville girls soccer team into the Oakville High School Hall of Fame on May 2, 2008; and
