#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

According to officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)**, many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** state they will need to:

- Modify the format of the current license to allow for placement of the permanent disability indicator;
- Update the Missouri Driver Guide and related website information to show the availability of the new indicator and procedure of having the indicator placed on the license document; and,
- Develop a medical statement form for applicants to use to verify permanent disability for purposes of obtaining the notation/indicator on the license or nondriver license.

DOR further states this proposed legislation will require programming changes to the Missouri Electronic Driver License (MEDL), also referred to as Over The Counter (OTC), software and supporting applications. These programming changes will need to be designed and tested.

FY10 - 80 Estimated hours for project completion (requirements and system testing) X \$100 Hourly rate for an OTC contractor = \$8,000

The **Office of Administration Information Technology (ITSD DOR)** estimates that this legislation could be implemented utilizing 2 existing CIT III's for 2 months at a rate of \$4,441/mo for a total cost of \$17,764. ITSD DOR estimates the IT portion of this request can be accomplished within existing resources; however; if priorities shift, additional FTE/overtime would be needed to implement.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal allows an individual who is permanently disabled to apply to the Department of Revenue (DOR) to have a notation indicating that status on his or her driver's or nondriver's license. DOR will establish the cost and criteria for the placement of the notation.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
