FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Missouri Department of Transportation, and Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety (DPS) - Directors' Office** state they are unable to determine the fiscal impact of the proposal and defer to the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan for response regarding the potential fiscal impact.

Officials from the **DPS - Missouri State Highway Patrol (MHP)** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for response regarding the potential fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC)** state the proposed legislation would not appear to have a fiscal impact on MDC funds since MDC's plan is self-insured and dependent coverage for adopted children is already provided..

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** state the legislation does not revise Chapter 208, RSMo. Therefore, it does not affect MO HealthNet eligibility or benefits.

It is unclear what is meant by "Medicaid health benefit plans." If the term is referring to HMOs that contract with the state to provide health benefits to MO HealthNet Managed Care participants, then the MHD assumes no fiscal impact.

Oversight notes the proposal is to be effective for plans issued on and after January 1, 2010.
