FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** state the Office of Tattoo, Body Piercing and Branding estimates applications will begin being received in FY 11 and approximately 10 applicants will apply for licensure for permanent cosmetics in each FY 11 and FY 12. Initial licensure revenue is estimated to be \$300 per year (10 applicants X \$30 licensing fee). Licensure renewal will begin in FY 13.

The office also estimates that it will incur an initial expense for the programming and implementation of this licensure category to the division's licensure system. The division estimates this initial programming will occur in FY 10 and will be approximately \$540.

Oversight notes that costs and revenues associated with this proposal are minimal and therefore, will not be showing an impact to the Tattoo Fund.
