FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** state Section 571.101 lowers the minimum age to obtain a concealed carry weapons endorsement from age 23 to age 21. Officials assume this requires a change to the Missouri Electronic Driver License system to modify the age edit to obtain a CCW endorsement. DOR will also need to update their website information regarding concealed carry endorsement issuance.

DOR assumes they will incur the following Administrative Impact:

- Update their website information regarding concealed carry endorsement issuance; and
- Work with the Missouri Sheriff's Association to ensure all Sheriff Agencies are notified of changes in age requirements.

DOR assumes this legislation will require programming changes to the Missouri Electronic Driver License (MEDL also referred to as Over The Counter-OTC) software and supporting applications. These programming changes will need to be designed and tested. DOR assumes 20 estimated hours for project completion (requirements and system testing) x \$100 (hourly rate for an OTC contractor) = \$2,000

DOR states Office of Administration Information Technology (ITSD DOR) estimates that this legislation could be implemented utilizing one existing CIT III for 1 month at a rate of \$4,441. Office of Administration Information Technology (ITSD DOR) estimates the IT portion of this request can be accomplished within existing resources; however; if priorities shift, additional FTE/overtime would be needed to implement.

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assume revenues may increase proportionate to the number of people between 21 and 23 who become eligible and apply for permits. Officials assumes staff costs would potentially increase due to the increased number of applications to be processed and eligibility checks to be conducted.

Oversight assumes county sheriffs departments could experience increased revenues and increased costs due to the increased number of applications. For fiscal note purposes, Oversight assumes the revenues generated will equal the costs for processing the applications.

Officials from the Clark County Sheriff's Department, Greene County Sheriff's Department, Jackson County Sheriff's Department, Platte County Sheriff's Department, and the St. Louis County Police Department did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposed legislation lowers the minimum age requirement for obtaining a concealed carry endorsement from 23 years of age to 21 years of age.
