## FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Department of Public Safety - Division of Fire Safety, Division of Water Safety, Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Missouri Highway Patrol, MoDOT & Patrol Employees' Retirement System, Attorney General's Office, State Tax Commission, Capitol Police, Department of Agriculture, Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, Department of Higher Education, Office of State Courts Administrator, State Emergency Management Association, Missouri Ethics Commission, State Public Defender, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Missouri Department of Conservation, State Auditor's Office, Department of Revenue, Missouri Senate, Department of Mental Health, Department of Corrections, Department of Social Services, Attorney General's Office, Missouri Gaming Commission, Office of Administration - Division of Budget & Planning, Missouri House of Representatives, State Treasurer's Office, Department of Health and Senior Services, State Treasurer's Office, Division of Purchasing & Materials Management, Missouri State Public Defender, Department of Economic Development, Administrative Hearing Commission, Office of Prosecution Services and Missouri Veteran's Commission assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State** (SOS) many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's Office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal not to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The Secretary of State's Office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a give year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what their office can sustain with their core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
