FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions, and Professional Registration, Missouri Department of Transportation and Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS) - Children's Division** state the proposal does not impact their division or children adopted through their division.

Officials from the **DOS - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** state the proposal does not revise Chapter 208 or Chapter 376, RSMo, and therefore, will not impact the MHD.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for response regarding the potential fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on their organization.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC)** assume the proposed legislation would not have a fiscal impact on MDC funds since MDC's plan is self-insured and dependent coverage for adopted children is already provided.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
