

HCS HB 1383 -- MISSOURI ACCOUNTABILITY PORTAL (Cox)

COMMITTEE OF ORIGIN: Special Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

This substitute requires every department and division of the state that receives any grant of federal funds of \$1 million or more to document certain information and make that information easily available on the Missouri Accountability Portal. This information must be updated within 30 days of any receipt or transferal of funds.

If a grant of federal funds is transferred to another department or division, the department or division receiving the funds must report to the department or division from which the funds came and account for how the funds were used and any statistical impact that can be determined to result from the usage.

The cost to administer these provisions must be paid from the grant of federal funds and not from any amount of state funds appropriated to any department or division. The Office of Administration must promulgate rules to implement these provisions.

The Governor must submit a daily report stating all amounts withheld from the state's operating budget for the current fiscal year. The daily report must be conspicuously posted on the accountability portal website, searchable by the amounts withheld from each individual fund, and searchable by the total amount withheld from the operating budget.

Every department and division of this state that receives any grant of federal funds must determine whether or not any or all of the funds can be used for the Alternatives to Abortion Services Program or the Alternatives to Abortion Public Awareness Program. The federal funds for which the determination must be made must include, but not be limited to, maternal and child health block grant; social services block grant; community development block grant; temporary assistance for needy families; community services block grant; head start; Pregnancy Assistance Fund Program; Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program; community-based child abuse prevention grants; child care and development block grant; promoting safe and stable families; abandoned infants; infant adoption awareness training; healthy start initiative; healthy marriage promotion and responsible fatherhood grants; and any successor funds. Each department and division must submit the required information to the Office of Administration at least annually. The Office of Administration must compile the information and submit it to the chairs of the House Budget Committee and the Senate

Appropriations Committee and make the information easily available to the public on the portal.

The substitute contains an emergency clause.
