HB 1388 -- Teacher Tenure

Sponsor: Aull

This bill changes the laws regarding teacher tenure in all school districts except the City of St. Louis. In its main provisions, the bill:

- (1) Revises the definition of "permanent teacher" from a teacher who has been employed in the same school district for five successive years to a teacher who has been employed in the same school district for at least three successive years and who has been designated by the school district board as a permanent teacher;
- (2) Revises the definition of "probationary teacher" from a teacher who has been employed in the same school district from five successive years of less to a teacher who has been employed in the school district for less than seven successive years without being granted permanent status. The bill also allows a school district to waive a second year of the probationary period of a teacher who has been employed by another school district for two or more years. The current requirement to waive one year is unchanged;
- (3) Requires a performance improvement plan to be created for any probationary teacher who completes five successive years of teaching without being granted tenure. The plan will continue until the earlier of a grant of tenure or the completion of the seventh year without the granting of tenure;
- (4) Clarifies that a probationary teacher in his or her first and second years is automatically rehired unless he or she receives a notice of termination; and
- (5) Requires each district to align its teacher evaluation standards with the standards for teaching adopted by the State Board of Education within the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
