FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** stated this proposed legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

According to officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)**, many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what their office can sustain with their core budget. Therefore, SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal with core funding. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education (DHE)** state that 20 individuals were paid under this program in FY 2013. DHE was able to locate national data on the number of deaths of Emergency Medical Technicians, but was unable to find state level information or information about the number of deaths that occurred in the line of duty. However, given the data available and the current distribution of recipients, which are primarily peace officers, DHE estimates this change will result in the payment of two additional individuals during the period of the fiscal impact statement. The FY 2013 average award under this program was \$5,121. Inflating that number at 3 percent per year, the average award for FY 2015 would be \$5,433. The total needed to pay two additional recipients would be \$10,866. Those numbers are inflated by 3 percent for FY 2016 and FY 2017.

Officials from **Missouri Western State University, Missouri State University, Linn State Technical College, Northwest Missouri State University,** and the **University of Central Missouri** all stated no direct fiscal impact associated with this proposed legislation.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the following colleges and universities: Crowder, East Central Community College, Harris-Stowe, Jefferson College, Kansas City Metro Community College, Lincoln University, Moberly Area Community College, Missouri Southern State University, Southeast Missouri State University, State Fair Community College, St. Charles Community College, St. Louis Community College, Three Rivers Community College, Truman State University, and the University of Missouri System did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

This bill adds an emergency medical technician to the definition of "public safety officer" for purposes of eligibility for the Survivor's and Disabled Employee's Educational Grant Program.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
