**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

**ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** assume this proposal will have no fiscal impact. The MHD assumes that participants are currently receiving all vaccinations that they are seeking.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** state all Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommended immunizations are already covered at 100%. Therefore, the MoDOT assumes there would be no fiscal impact on the medical plan.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, and the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

This proposal could have a positive fiscal impact on small business pharmacy providers.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
