

HB 1978 -- RADIATION MONITORING AT BRIDGETON LANDFILL

SPONSOR: Curtis

This bill requires the Department of Natural Resources to conduct monitoring for radioactivity in the air, water, soil, plant, and animal life at Bridgeton Landfill in the City of Bridgeton as necessary to insure the protection of the public health and safety of the environment. The department must provide a public web portal that provides real-time data on air conditions at a minimum of four evenly distributed points along the perimeter of the landfill that must include specified compounds with the sensitivity necessary to determine if chronic exposure levels are being exceeded. The department must also conduct specified radiation monitoring.
