Bill Summary: This proposal specifies that a responsive pleading shall be filed in any motion to modify a child support, spousal maintenance, or child custody judgment.

Fiscal Analysis


Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials at the **Department of Mental Health** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Oversight assumes this proposal specifies that a responsive pleading shall be filed in any motion to modify a child support, spousal maintenance, or child custody judgment. Oversight assumes this is a change in policy and procedures when filing a motion and will have no fiscal impact.

FISCAL ANALYSIS (continued)
