AN ACT

Relating to the designation of Missouri No Smoking/No Tobacco Day.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, on May 15, 1987, the World Health Organization (WHO) passed a resolution calling for April 7, 1988, to be the first "World No Smoking Day", a date chosen 2 3 because it was the 40th anniversary of WHO; and 4 5 WHEREAS, on May 17, 1989, the World Health Organization passed a resolution 6 calling for May 31st to be annually known as "World No Tobacco Day", which has been 7 observed each year since 1989; and 8 9 WHEREAS, medical research made it clear during the 1900s that tobacco use increased 10 the likelihood of many illnesses, including heart attacks, strokes, chronic obstructive pulmonary 11 disease (COPD), emphysema, and many forms of cancer; and 12 13 **WHEREAS**, the aim of a no smoking/tobacco day is to inform the public about the 14 dangers of using tobacco and is a day for people, non-governmental organizations, and governments to organize and conduct various activities to increase awareness about such 15 16 dangers; and 17 18 **WHEREAS**, the citizens of the State of Missouri wish to send a message of global 19 solidarity against smoking by observing a no smoking/tobacco day to coincide with "World No 20 Tobacco Day": 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of 22 23 Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate 24 concurring therein, hereby designate May 31st each year to be "Missouri No Smoking/Tobacco 25 Day" to be held in conjunction with the "World No Tobacco Day" to increase awareness about the negative effects of tobacco use on our citizens, families, friends, and communities; and 26 27

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the citizens of this state are encourage to observe the day with appropriate events and activities aimed at preventing people from starting tobacco use and assisting those who currently use tobacco in learning not only how, but why it is vitally important to stop their tobacco use; and
