AN ACT

To amend chapter 254, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to state forestry.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 254, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 254.310 and 254.315, to read as follows:

254.310. 1. For purposes of this section, the term "clear cutting" shall mean the felling of most or all of the trees in a tract of forest.

- 2. The department of conservation, conservation commission, and the state forester shall manage state-owned forest land for current and future generations and shall eliminate the practice of clear cutting on state-owned forest land.
- 254.315. 1. There is hereby established the "Forestry Management Consortium", to review and prescribe management plans for each tract of state-owned forest land, which shall consist of representation from the following:
 - (1) The Missouri Forest Products Association;
 - (2) The Missouri Consulting Foresters Association;
- 6 (3) The University of Missouri-Columbia School of Natural Resources; and
- 7 (4) The United States Department of Agriculture Forest Service North Central 8 Research Station.
- 2. The forestry management consortium shall develop criteria to assess the condition and health of each tract of state-owned forest land in the state. Using the criteria developed by the forestry management consortium, the department of conservation shall assess each tract of state-owned forest land in the state.

3. The forestry management consortium shall develop and prescribe a management plan for each tract of state-owned forest land to maximize the health and timber production of such land. Each management plan shall be for a period of twenty years.

- 4. The department of conservation shall implement each management plan developed and approved by the forestry management consortium without variance. If the department of conservation determines that a management plan needs to be revised prior to the twenty-year period expiring, it may request the consortium to review and revise the plan.
- 5. All necessary expenses incurred by the forestry management consortium shall be paid for by the department of conservation.
