HB 1278 -- RESISTING ARREST

SPONSOR: Kidd

This bill defines an "aggravated offender" as anyone who has been convicted of any fleeing offense three times. An aggravated offender who pleads guilty to a violation of these provisions is guilty of a class B felony. The bill defines a "prior offender" as anyone who has been convicted of any fleeing offense and is charged with another fleeing offense within five years of the previous conviction. A prior offender who pleads guilty to a violation of these provisions is guilty of a class C felony.

Anyone convicted under the provisions of the bill will not be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended execution or imposition of sentence for a period of three calendar years.
