1 AMEND Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 646, Page 1, in the Title, Lines 2-3, by
2 deleting the phrase "youth suicide awareness and prevention" and inserting in lieu thereof the phrase
3 "elementary and secondary"; and
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5 Further amend said bill, Page 2, Section 170.048, Line 24, by inserting immediately after said line
6 the following:

7 "170.310. 1. For school year 2017-18 and each school year thereafter, upon graduation
8 from high school, pupils in public schools and charter schools shall have received thirty minutes of
9 cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction and training in the proper performance of the Heimlich
10 maneuver or other first aid for choking given any time during a pupil's four years of high school.

11 2. Beginning in school year 2017-18, any public school or charter school serving grades
12 nine through twelve [may] shall provide enrolled students instruction in cardiopulmonary
13 resuscitation. Students with disabilities may participate to the extent appropriate as determined by
14 the provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section 504 of the
15 Rehabilitation Act. [Instruction may be embedded in any health education course] Instruction shall
16 be included in the district's existing health or physical education curriculum. Instruction shall be
17 based on a program established by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, or
18 through a nationally recognized program based on the most current national evidence-based
19 emergency cardiovascular care guidelines, and psychomotor skills development shall be
20 incorporated into the instruction. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use
21 of hands-on practicing and skills testing to support cognitive learning.

22 [2.] 3. The teacher of the cardiopulmonary resuscitation course or unit shall not be required
23 to be a certified trainer of cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the instruction is not designed to result in
24 certification of students. Instruction that is designed to result in certification being earned shall be
25 required to be taught by an authorized cardiopulmonary instructor. Schools may develop
26 agreements with any local chapter of a voluntary organization of first responders to provide the
27 required hands-on practice and skills testing.

28 [3.] 4. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules to
29 implement this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that
30 is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies
31 with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This
32 section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly
33 pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are
34 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or
35 adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void."; and
