AN ACT

To amend chapter 162, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to camera systems for certain classrooms.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 162, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 162.717, to read as follows:

162.717. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, each public school shall install and maintain camera systems in each classroom in which a child with a disability regularly receives special educational services.

4 2. The camera systems required under subsection 1 of this section shall provide full 5 video coverage of each classroom subject to the requirements of this section. The video recording made by such systems for a school day shall be automatically saved and 6 accessible to school administrators for at least thirty days after the date of such recording. 7 8 Such systems shall also allow any school administrator to save any recording for a particular school day for any period of time beyond thirty days. Access to the video 9 10 recordings shall be limited in a manner consistent with state and federal law and as provided for by rule of the department of elementary and secondary education. 11

3. Any classroom in which the majority of children receiving educational services
in such classroom are not children with disabilities shall not be subject to the requirements
of subsection 1 of this section.

4. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate rules
 to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall

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become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2016, shall be invalid and void.

5. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Classroom Camera Fund". The fund shall consist of any gifts, bequests, or public or private donations to such fund. Any moneys in the fund shall be used to assist districts in installing and maintaining the camera systems required under subsection 1 of this section. Any person or entity that makes a gift, bequest, or donation to the fund may specify the school district that shall be the recipient of such gift, bequest, or donation.

30 (2) The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 31 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements of public moneys in 32 accordance with distribution requirements and procedures developed by the department 33 of elementary and secondary education and shall make disbursements of private funds 34 according to the directions of the donor. If the donor did not specify how the private funds were to be disbursed, the state treasurer shall contact the donor to determine the manner 35 36 of disbursement. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in 37 the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this section.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys
 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
 general revenue fund.

41 (4) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other
42 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited
43 to the fund.

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
