AN ACT

To amend chapter 1, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to regulations resulting from presidential executive orders.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 1, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 1.345, to read as follows:

1.345. 1. Any federal regulation, rule, or memorandum promulgated as a result of an executive order of the President of the United States and not justified by federal law or the limited constitutional authority of the President of the United States is repugnant to the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of Missouri if such regulation, rule, or memorandum purported to function in the same manner as federal statutory law adopted by the United State Congress and shall be declared invalid in this state. Such regulations, rules, or memorandums shall be considered null and void and of no effect, and no agency or political subdivision of this state shall take any action or utilize any resources to give effect to such rules, regulations, or memorandums.

2. It shall be duty of the general assembly to adopt and enact any and all measures as may be necessary to prevent the enforcement of regulations, rules, and memorandums issued by a presidential executive order.

3. This section shall not supercede executive orders property governing the internal affairs of federal agencies or employees.
