2	WHEREAS , each of us expects and deserves safe drinking water. In Missouri, our sources of water supply continue to be pure and plentiful; and

4 5 6	WHEREAS , water absorbs naturally occurring minerals as it travels over the surface of the land or through the ground and may also pick up substances resulting from animal and human activity; and

8 9 10	WHEREAS , substances and contaminants that could be present in source water include microbes, organic and inorganic compounds, pesticides and herbicides, and radioactive materials; and
11	
12 13 14	WHEREAS , in 1973, contractors responsible for cleaning up Latty Avenue illegally dumped large amounts of radioactive material at West Lake Landfill in Bridgeton after drying and shipping operations had been abandoned; and
15	
16 17 18	WHEREAS, West Lake is in the Missouri River floodplain, and some of the buried radioactive wastes may be in contact with the groundwater that flows into the Missouri River, upstream from drinking water intakes for North St. Louis County and the City of St. Louis; and

2021	WHEREAS, West Lake Landfill is adjacent to the Earth City levee, and the radioactive materials at West Lake could be released into the Missouri River if the levee fails; and

23 24 25	WHEREAS, the federal Environmental Protection Agency and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources collaboratively regulate the amount of contaminants allowed in public drinking water to ensure its safety; and
2627282930	WHEREAS, Missouri American Water has been delivering high-quality water service to its customers for more than 100 years, and its water quality consistently meets or surpasses state and federal requirements; and
31 32 33 34 35	WHEREAS, Missouri American Water's water treatment plants are members of the Partnership for Safe Water, a national voluntary initiative developed by the Environmental Protection Agency to recognize water suppliers that consistently achieve water treatment standards that surpass regulatory requirements, and fewer than one percent of water utilities in the country have achieved this recognition; and
37 38 39 40	WHEREAS, Missouri American Water was one of six organizations that received the Governor's Natural Resources Award of Excellence from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources in 2014 for leadership in effectively managing natural resources including the stewardship of the Missouri River and local watersheds:
